Breakfast is available daily for all students. Cost is \$1.50 for students.


For those who currently qualify for reduced price lunch the cost is .30 cents. Eligible free lunch students are also entitled to free breakfast.

Thank you all for collecting box tops this fall.


3,359 box tops were collected at KTES.

All forms must be returned to the attention of Mrs. DeFalco by Monday, December 3, 2018. Any Teacher or Educational Services Professional that has not received the award in the past five years is eligible. Eligibility criteria:

Any educators nominated for this award must meet all of the following requirements:

- Be an exceptionally skilled and dedicated licensed classroom teacher (pre-K through grade 12) or educational service professional (LDTC, School Counselor/Social Worker, School Nurse, School Psychologist, Speech-Language Specialist, School Library Media Specialist, Instructional Paraprofessional, School Occupational Therapist, School Physical Therapist)
- Must have achieved a 2017-18 summative rating of Effective or higher
- Be a dedicated and skilled teacher leader who anticipates actively continuing his/her teaching career for at least five (5) more years
- Be an expert in the field who inspires students of all backgrounds and abilities to learn
- Actively collaborates with colleagues, students, and families to create a strong culture of respect and success
- Demonstrate **leadership and innovation in educational activities** at the school, district, and/or state and national levels that take place both within and outside the school setting.
- Have the respect and admiration of students, parents, and colleagues
- Demonstrate poise, eloquence, and the ability to maintain a demanding schedule
- Have not earned the title of Teacher of the Year or Educational Services Professional of the year for the past five (5) years

Schools taking part in educator recognition programs have found participation to promote a culture that recognizes excellence and creates a sense of pride.
