#### **Attention Parents of Future Kindergarten**

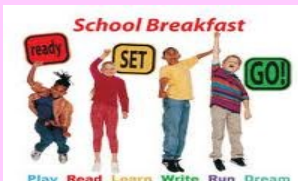
**Students:** Knowlton Twp. Elementary School is planning for the 2019-2020 school year. At this time we would like to identify as many children as possible who will be eligible for Kindergarten in September 2019. To be eligible for kindergarten, a child must be 5 years old by October 1, 2019. If you have not already done so, and you have a child who will be eligible for next year's kindergarten class, kindly call the school at (908) 475-5118, ext. 200 as soon as possible. Dates for screening of next year's kindergarten students will be released at a later date. Parents will receive details in the mail. Please pass this information along to anyone in Knowlton Twp. who may have a child eligible for kindergarten in September 2019. The parent information meeting will take place on Monday, April 1st at 6 pm in the school library. You will receive a letter in the mail.











## EAST WING STUDENT DROP OFF PROCEDURES

### REVISED Car Drop-off procedure at the East Wing in the Morning.

1. The window for student arrival is from 8:32 AM to 8:40 AM. School doors open at 8:32 AM and students are not to exit the cars until 8:32. If your child arrives after the 8:40 school bell, signaling the start of classes, please report to the front of the building, park your car and escort your child into the office to sign in.
2. **For safety reasons, children should ALWAYS exit the vehicle from the right passenger /building side.**
3. Enter the driveway and proceed to the student drop-off area at the East Wing entrance. If cars are behind you, please pull forward to the end of the semi-circle so that cars behind you can also move into the area. Do not park on the sides of the circle or in the grass to wait. **All cars need to be using the lined semi-circle for safety purposes.**
4. When your child exits passenger side only and is safely near the entrance, please leave the drop-off area. A problem develops when parents sit in their cars and wait until the child enters the building.
5. Please do not park or leave your vehicle standing in the drop-off area as it creates a backlog of cars that need to move past the drop off area. If you need to come into the building, even for a few moments, please use the main entrance .
6. **No car should pull around another car in line. This creates a hazardous situation and endangers our students.**

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If your child has strep throat or another bacterial infection, he/she should stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school. We encourage you to seek medical attention when your child is sick and to follow your health care provider's recommendations about returning to school and other activities.
