IF YOU ARE STILL HAVING TROUBLE ACCESSING THE PARENT PORTAL...

Still experiencing difficulties in getting on the Parent Portal? If you are getting a message regarding "no district" detected, try this...

- Go up to your browser and highlight "no district" to the end, delete that, and then type in knowlton and hit enter.
 The parent portal login page should now appear asking for your portal code, user name & password.
- If that does not work, go to the school website,
 www.knowltonschool.com and click on the "For Parents"
 Tab, Resources, then Parent Portal. The parent portal login
 page should now appear asking for your portal code, user
 name & password. Do Not Click on the Parent Portal Icon
 the first time you are accessing the portal. Once you
 have successfully accessed the portal the Parent Portal
 Icon Tab should work correctly.
- Should you still have trouble, please call the main office and we will try to help you gain access.

Regarding Student Lunch Accounts:

Project Child Find

Parents:

Do you have a preschooler experiencing significant difficulties with speech and language, fine motor skills, gross motor skills or behavior? Is he/she struggling to learn the basic early concepts? Is your school age child struggling with reading or math? Does your child have difficulty with writing tasks or written expression?

Project Child Find was established by the New Jersey Sate Department of Education as a free public awareness and referral service to assist parents and professionals by identifying available early intervention programs and services for infants and toddlers through two years of age and free, appropriate public education programs and services for pupils who are disabled three through twenty one years of age. Parents or other appropriate persons may refer children who are experiencing significant difficulties.

BABIES FROM BIRTH TO AGE 3 who are thought to have developmental delays may receive assistance from the Early Intervention Program. CHILDREN AGES 3 TO 5 who are experiencing physical, sensory, emotional, communication and cognitive and/or social difficulties may be eligible for special education and related services through their local Child Study Team. Parents should contact the Knowlton Twp. Elementary School Child Study Team office at 475-5118 ext. 208 or 114 for further information.

IF PARENTS ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THEIR SCHOOL AGE CHILD'S

PROGRESS, they should feel free to discuss such issues with their child's teacher and/or principal at 475-5118. Parents have the option of making a referral to the I & RS Team, or Interventions and Referral Services Team. I & RS team offers intervention procedures that are provided within the regular education school program. At times more extensive interventions are necessary to assist the student. If the decision is to undertake a full Child Study Team evaluation the child's social, emotional and academic status may be assessed. Medical or other specialized evaluations may also be included at no cost to the parent. If a child is determined to be eligible for special education and related services, an IEP or Individual Education Plan will be developed. The IEP will include a rationale for the student's educational placement and the basis for the program implementation.

2020 has arrived and we are ready to accomplish more great things between now and the end of this school year. This week our Board of Education held its reorganization meeting. We appreciate all of our board members' willingness to serve and give back.

Maintaining a safe learning environment for the children of Knowlton Township Elementary remains a top priority for our Board of Education. Recently, a safety strobe light was installed at our school as part of the district's ongoing commitment to school safety. The strobe light acts as an integrated emergency communication system. In the event of an emergency, the strobe light is activated, serving the dual purpose of alerting law enforcement personnel of the situation while communicating to any students, staff and parents who are outside the building to stay away and not to attempt to enter the building.

We are so proud of the work our staff and students do on a daily basis both inside and outside of the classroom. Our Knowlton Debate team, headed by Mrs. Reber, competed in December and our affirmative team brought back the bronze medal. Congratulations to Isabel, Joey, Jocelyn and Emily. Mrs. Perry applied to the Lysol® and Kinsa FLUency™ school health program through the WeAreTeachers contest and we were selected as a runner-up. Mrs. Acker, our school nurse, served as our point of contact for families and staff. Thank you to all the staff members and families who registered for the Kinsa app and we hope you are enjoying your new thermometers. Our Early Act Club, Ms. Maxman and Ms. Hollmann, our school counselor worked tirelessly to provide holiday cheer to many community families. Thank you to all who assisted our organizers with this. The Knowlton Township Elementary School Green Team continues to work on Sustainable NJ actions inside and outside of the building. This Spring be sure to look for updates on our greenhouse and rain barrel. Knowlton Township Elementary School has achieved bronze certification, valid 2019-2022. The Green Team committee consists of Mrs. DeFalco, Mrs. Carroll, Mrs. Apgar, Mrs. Garrison, Mrs. Janeiro and Mrs. Plunkett.

Chess Club has started again this year during recess and the advisors, Mr. Ferry and Mrs. Reber, are as excited as the students!
