

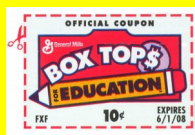

IF YOU ARE STILL HAVING TROUBLE ACCESSING THE PARENT PORTAL...

Still experiencing difficulties in getting on the Parent Portal? If you are getting a message regarding "no district" detected, try this...

- Go up to your browser and highlight "no district" to the end, delete that, and then type in knowlton and hit enter. The parent portal login page should now appear asking for your portal code, user name & password.
- **If that does not work, go to the school website,** www.knowltonschool.com and click on the "For Parents" Tab, Resources, then Parent Portal. The parent portal login page should now appear asking for your portal code, user name & password. **Do Not Click on the Parent Portal Icon the first time you are accessing the portal.** Once you have successfully accessed the portal the Parent Portal Icon Tab should work correctly.
- Should you still have trouble, please call the main office and we will try to help you gain access.

Regarding Student Lunch Accounts:

Periodically we run a report showing lunch accounts that are in the negative. A letter is then sent home with your child or an automated phone call is made to alert parents that money is owed on the account.

Upon receipt of such, please remit payment via the parent portal or by sending a check or money to school in an envelope with your child's name on it.

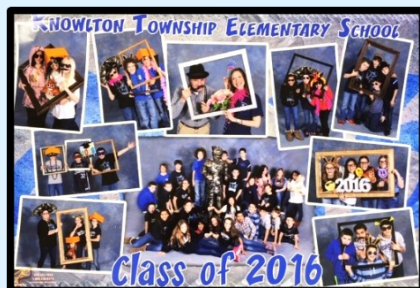

Cough Drop Procedures While at School

There are occasions when a student may benefit having cough drops while at school, a tickle in their throat, a sore throat, or cough, etc.... Cough drops may be sent in with your child but must be accompanied by written parental permission.

I have attached a form you can use when you are sending cough drops to school for your student. This note is current for long as the student has symptoms during this illness. A new one needs to be completed and signed for each illness.

Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd grade students' cough drops will be kept in my office. Students in 3, 4, 5 & 6 are allowed to manage their cough drop use independently.

Students must report to the school nurse each morning with their note for me to initial and date. This check in is for the purpose of monitoring the duration of your student's symptoms.

A kindergartener counted in the 2020 Census this spring will be starting high school when the next census comes around in 2030: That's 10 years of school supplies, teachers, school lunches, and so much more. This is your opportunity to help ensure they have a bright future.

Right now, students across the country are getting an introduction to the 2020 Census through the Statistics in Schools program. This program offers free activities and resources to schools to help prepare their students for an increasingly data-driven world.

Students are learning that the 2020 Census is a count of every person who lives in the United States and its territories. Responding to the census helps your community get its fair share of funding. Census data guides how more than \$675 billion in federal funding is distributed to states and communities each year for schools, health care facilities, roads, transportation, recreation centers, social services, and more.

On Census Day, April 1, 2020, start shaping your future and the future of all children by counting everyone in your home.

Students are also learning these key things about the 2020 Census—and we want you to know them too:

- Starting in March 2020, everyone living in your home needs to be counted. That includes children and newborn babies, citizens and noncitizens, relatives and nonrelatives, and even those staying with you temporarily.
- It's easier than ever to respond to the census. You can respond in 13 different languages, and you can complete it online, by phone, or by mail.
- Your responses to the census are safe and secure. The law requires the U.S. Census Bureau to keep your information confidential, and your responses cannot be used against you in any way.

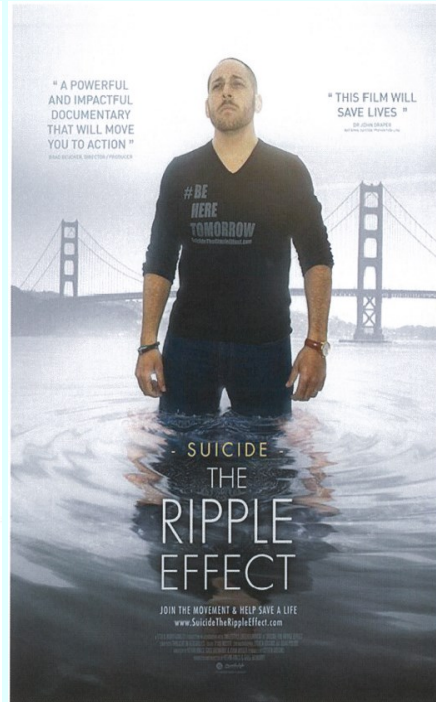
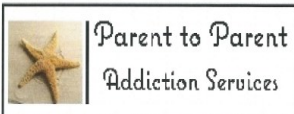
