Superintendent's Report

Mrs. DeFalco gave the following report:

- * LEAD program for grade 6 The 10 lessons have started with Trooper Madia. Students will engage in lesson 3 tomorrow. LEAD = Law Enforcement Against Drugs
- * Last week we experienced a dip in our water pressure here at the school resulting in cancelling all after school activities as a precaution. An all call was sent out and water pressure began regulating fairly quickly and there was no disruption to a running a regular schedule the following day.
- * We received official notice on January 17th that our current Sustainable Jersey for Schools actions were submitted, received and currently under review. Our current designation is bronze and we hope to advance to silver in the very near future.
- * Our mid-year eSpark results were shared with me (grades K-2) and the data shows a pre quiz average score of 50% to post quiz average of 71%. Last week 506 quests were mastered by our students.
- * Our mid-year group fluency average for Reflex math users is 73.9%. The starting fluency at the beginning of this school year was 41.9% for this group of students. There are 103 students utilizing Reflex Math.
- * On February 4th and 5th, I will be attending a two day Legal One Student Mental Health series. The workshop series is presented through NJPSA. (New Jersey Principals and Supervisors Association)

Vice Principal's Report

Mrs. Carroll gave the following report:

- * Over the course of the month, I have attended 2 workshops and participated in a webinar. The webinar was about tenure and seniority and how it applies to positions within a school district. The workshops I attended were about Standards Based Report Cards presented by Dr. Robert Zywicki, the Superintendent of Mt. Olive and the importance of differentiation and various ways it looks like in a classroom.
- * The Early Act Club is in the middle of their Souper Bowl for Caring food drive. If you would like to make a donation, they need to be received no later than Friday.
- * The Spelling Bee was held on Jan. 9th. The winner is here tonight, Paityn Bates, she will go on to the next round which is a written test in a few weeks and from there if she passes, she will compete in March at Northampton Community College.
- * We have our dates set for the incoming kindergarten parent meeting in April, kindergarten screening in May, and the bus ride and orientation in June. To date we have 11 registered.

- * Next Wednesday, we will be participating in World Read Aloud Day. Mrs. Reber has scheduled 3 authors to skype with various classes throughout the day.
- * We will be doing One Book One School again for Read across America. The book this year is *The World According to Humphrey*.
