## Superintendent's Report

Mrs. DeFalco gave the following report:

- \* As of March 1, 2021, 90% of our student population will have returned to in-person learning.
- \* ESSER II (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) funding amounts were released, along with Learning Acceleration and Mental Health Supports & Services allocations. We will review carefully and begin determining how we can best utilize these allocations to support our staff and students.
- \* I am participating in a four week SEL Health Series facilitated by Dr. Jared Scherz. This is a program being brought forth by the New Jersey Association of School Administrators. Today was the first session for the North.
- \* A new program this year called PTA Reflections was available for students to participate in. Cyrus Wittreich submitted a drawing in the visual arts category in the Primary (Pre-K 2<sup>nd</sup>) Division. He has received an award of excellence for his submission and his entry advanced on to the county and state levels.
- \* We have some great technology platforms in use with both our in-person and virtual learners. Nearpod has identified the following teachers as top users: Debbie Lennox and Lisa Garrison. Flocabulary has identified the following teachers as top users: Misty Baker and Terri Kwasnik. Our IXL leaders for questions answered by class are Katy Jones students with 49,941 and Pam Janeiro's students with 37,468.
- \* Some questions have been asked regarding sixth grade promotion. At this time, we are awaiting guidance from the Governor's office regarding what this year's celebration may look like. We do know that social distancing and masking requirements are expected to remain in place.
- \* Mrs. Tate has found a way to create and show our students' artwork as an alternate to the traditional Art Show. She had hoped to utilize Artsonia but due to some unexpected issues she opted not to. She will be joining the March board meeting to share Art Show slide show.

## Vice Principal's Report

Mrs. Carroll gave the following report:

- \* Because of the virtual and snow days, I have extended our mid-year assessments due date until March 5<sup>th</sup>.
- \* I am currently working with Mrs. Tate and Mrs. Lestrange on review of the new Visual and Performing Arts Standards. The state has put out new standards overhauling these subjects.
- \* I attended the Administrator Coffee Hour through the School Support Social Network. It was an informal discussion about issues we are facing in our schools.
- \* Teacher schedules are all updated and reflect our 5 day a week in-person return.

#### **MOTIONS**

#### 1. Resolution

A motion was made by Mrs. Smith seconded by Mr. Baley and carried unanimously to request the adoption of a resolution for Governor Murphy to include Public School District personnel in the official expert vaccine allotment panel's definition of frontline workers:

WHEREAS, the Knowlton Township Board of Education recognizes that the United States, the State of New Jersey and local health authorities, as well as the World Health Organization, have declared a public health emergency regarding the Coronavirus or COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the federal and state authorities have put in place guidance detailing the precautionary measures schools must implement to stop its spread of this disease; and

**WHEREAS**, public schools have a profound impact on millions of students, families and staff and are charged with the care, education, nourishment of their students and are an integral part of the health and safety of our communities; and

**WHEREAS**, our district has responded to the challenges brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, providing students and staff members with the technology and resources necessary to ensure the efficient delivery of instruction, virtually and in-person; and

**WHEREAS**, the board has a substantial public interest in protecting the health and safety of its students, staff, and community and ensuring that the district can provide staff and students with a safe and effective educational environment that supports student achievement; and

WHEREAS, the board recognizes that this health emergency made it necessary to close schools and reinvent the educational programs in a virtual setting and that this may have an adverse impact on student achievement and the emotional and social wellbeing of students; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 Vaccination Plan published by the State of New Jersey Department of Health (December 15, 2020, pgs. 36-37) prioritizes the availability of vaccines to "essential workers" in Phase 1B of the vaccine protocol; and

**WHEREAS**, school district staff at all levels are essential to the day-to-day operations of this district, responsible for the thorough and efficient education of all students and their social and emotional wellbeing, are critical for virtual and in-class instruction and are "essential workers;"

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the Knowlton Township Board of Education finds a substantial public purpose exists to request that Governor Murphy give appropriate priority in the statewide administration of the COVID-19 vaccine to all public school district personnel.
